

Report on Exposure Visit organized by AMDA to Indore City, Madhya Pradesh, on “IT / AI in Urban Governance: Traffic, Waste, Water & Citizen Services” from 30th July -1st Aug, 2026

1. Association of Municipalities and Development Authorities (AMDA), New Delhi organized an Exposure Visit to Indore City, Madhya Pradesh from 30.07.2026 to 01.08.2026. The program schedule is attached as Annexure – 1.

4. From AMDA Sh. Kalyan Sahai Meena, IAS (Retd.), Director cum-Secretary, Shri. Totak Acharya, Assistant Director (Planning), Sh. Sushil Kumar, Administrative Officer, Ms. Mansi Tewatia (Intern) and Sh. Sanjay Kr. Dubey, Photocopy Operator accompanied/facilitated the program.





The exposure visit, after a formal introduction of all present, commenced on 30.07.2026 with lamp lighting and a formal welcome address by Shri K. S. Meena, IAS (Retd.), Director cum-Secretary, AMDA. In his remarks, Shri Meena provided an overview of AMDA, outlining its objectives and key activities.

Shri. Totak Acharya, Assistant Director (Planning) and Ms. Mansi Tewatia (Intern) shared a brief presentation about AMDA's aims and objectives, core areas of work of AMDA, details about the webinars and previous notable tasks that were undertaken since 1983 and the relevance & importance of the ensued visit. It also contained that the visit intends to provide municipal and development authorities and policy makers first-hand insights into innovative practices in solid waste management, rain water harvesting structures, infrastructure financing, and governance models that can be replicated or adapted in other urban contexts.

5. Thereafter, Sh. Arth Jain, IAS, Additional Commissioner, Indore Municipal Corporation (IMC) and CEO, Indore Smart City Development Limited (ISCDL) during the inaugural session shared a brief about the activities being undertaken by Indore Smart City Development Limited.

Sh. Prakhar Singh, IAS, Additional Commissioner, Indore Municipal Corporation during the session shared about activities being undertaken by IMC under SBM Mission.

Further, three presentations were shared by Indore Municipal Corporation and ISCDL officials. The first presentation was related to the good practices being implemented by IMC in relation to Solid Waste Management.





The second presentation was on Rain water harvesting structures. The presentation included various sources of water available to Indore City, action plan of Indore City for the current year and the National Achievements of Indore in Water Conservation sector. It was followed by the planning and monitoring aspects. Further various methods of rain water harvesting undertaken by the city were also

shared. It was also conveyed that IMC has developed an application through which efforts are being done to support and guide citizens for installing rainwater harvesting structures at their homes.

The third presentation was related to various projects undertaken by Indore Smart City Development Limited (ISCDL). It included major projects related to Heritage Conservation and Facade Improvement, Riverfront, Parks Environment Upgradation, Smart Road, Parking, Sustainable Infrastructure, IT Enhancement, Digital Infrastructure, Land Monetization Revenue Generation etc.

The presentations were followed by Q&A session. Delegates participated in the Q & A session, hence making the session an interactive one.

6. The session was followed by a site visit to Rain Water Harvesting Sites. Officials from IMC and ISCDL assisted in the site visit.



Day - 1 ended with dinner at Sarovar Portico, Indore.

7. Day 2 started with site visit to Rajshahi Garbage Transfer Station, ISWM Control Room, Kesar Bagh RRR Center, Zero Waste Indoor Zoo, 550 TPD Gobardhan Plant (Asia's biggest Bio-Methanation Plant), 400 TPD Material Recovery Facility (Dry Waste Mechanical Sorting Plant), Bioremediation Site (Bioremediation of 15 Lakh tons of legacy waste and reclamation of 100-acre land) and Construction and Demolition Waste Processing Plant.





8. On day 3, Sludge Hyginization Plant of 100 TPD, developed for treatment of dried sludge was visited by the participants. The Site visit was followed by a structured discussion and Questions & Answers session, based upon the field observations of participants, for participants with the senior officials of IMC and ISCDL, officers namely Sh. Prakhar Singh, IAS, Additional Commissioner, and Ms. Shraddha Tomar, SWM Expert. Certificates to the delegates, who participated in the exposure visit, were distributed. It was followed by vote of Thanks by Sh. Kalyan Sahai Meena, (Retd.), Director cum-Secretary, AMDA at ICCC centre, Indore. A group photo session was organized. Day - 3 ended with Lunch at Sarovar Portico, Indore.
